

NHNG FEDERAL MISSION

To provide the Departments of the Army and Air Force with operationally-ready units and personnel in support of the Total Force, and for war or national emergency as ordered by the President; upon declaration of war by Congress; or as otherwise specified by federal law. The NH National Guard continues to provide support to federal and state law enforcement agencies with counter drug operations throughout the state. Guard personnel and resources are primarily assigned to reconnaissance and surveillance missions associated with the state's efforts to interdict and eradicate illegal drugs.

NHNG STATE MISSION

To provide the state and its political subdivisions with operationally ready units and personnel to protect life, property, and to preserve the internal security of the state when ordered by the Governor. The NH National Guard, along with other state agencies, assists State Emergency Management Agency in a time of natural disaster. The Guard may also be called upon to assist the NH State Police during civil unrest, or the NH Fish and Game Department for search and rescue operations.

TAG The Adjutant General – Appointed chief military commander and advisor to the Governor of New Hampshire.

TOPOFF Top Official Exercise – A national response to Weapons of Mass Destruction exercise, designed to test the rapid response of federal and state agencies in a simulated disaster exercise.

TWP Tuition Waiver Program – The National Guard Education Act allows tuition waiver for New Hampshire National Guard members enrolled in higher education through state supported institutions on a space available basis.

USP&FO United State Property & Fiscal Officer – A National Guard officer serving on federal active duty that receives and accounts for all federal funds and property provided for the operation of the National Guard of a state.

VTC Video Teleconferencing – Medium to conduct, view and participate in long distance conferences on a nationwide or worldwide basis.

Wing CC - Commander of the 157th Air Refueling Wing.

Wing Staff – NHANG Wing-level support functions including: Wing Plans, Financial Management, Safety, Environmental, Legal, Chaplain, and Public Affairs.

WMD Weapons of Mass Destruction – An explosive, or radiological, nuclear, biological, chemical weapon capable of far-reaching devastation.

ABBREVIATIONS & DEFINITIONS (Cont'd)

NHNGLC New Hampshire National Guard Leadership Council – A joint council of senior Air and Army leadership chaired by the Adjutant General designed to foster cooperation and collaboration in areas of mutual state and federal interest.

NICI National Interagency Counter Drug Institute – The National Guard agency that teaches the military Counter Drug programs in addition to Military Support to Civil Authorities programs.

Operations Group – Executes the NHANG air refueling and airlift missions.

PA Public Affairs – Provides liaison between the public and the military within the following areas: media relations, community relations, and legislative liaison.

R&R Recruiting & Retention – Recruits new members into the organization and retains fully qualified members in maintaining the overall organizational strength.

RTI Regional Training Institute – An Army training command located at the Regional Training Site providing Army technical, professional and leadership training.


RTS Regional Training Site – Army funded local training area at Center Strafford serving primarily military reserve components and local, state and federal agencies.

Support Group – Responsible for many NHANG support activities: Engineering (including civil engineering, emergency fire support, readiness training and snow removal), Military Personnel, Security Police, Information Management, Services (including food services, moral and welfare service and mortuary affairs), and Social Actions.


SPP State Partnership Program – Partnership program which provides interaction between New Hampshire National Guard and the military of El Salvador in support of the Commander in Chief, United States Southern Command's strategic engagement plan.

ABBREVIATIONS & DEFINITIONS (Cont'd)

DCSPER Deputy Chief of Staff Personnel - Provides personnel support to the New Hampshire Army National Guar. Formerly MILPO.

DTT Distant Training Technology – Medium to provide low cost distance learning services to soldiers, private and public organizations.

EMO Emergency Management Office – Provides emergency relief operations within the State of New Hampshire. Formerly called OEM.

ESSO Executive Support Staff Officer – A liaison between the Air Refueling Wing, The Adjutant General and National Guard Bureau.

HRD Human Resource Development – Manages employee and organizational development for New Hampshire National Guard full time employees

HRO Human Resource Office – Manages all personnel actions, training and benefits for New Hampshire National Guard full time employees.

IRT Innovative Readiness Training – Program by which the military skills are employed to assist community, state and federal agencies.

IW Information Warfare – Attacking or defending information management systems.

JTF Joint Task Force – Military force combining three or more military component organizations for a specific mission.

LL Legislative Liaison – Legislative program to brief local and state officials in the mission of the New Hampshire National Guard.

Logistics Group – Responsible for supply, aircraft maintenance , ground maintenance, and contracting for the NHANG.

MOA Memorandum of Agreement - Used to document mutually agreed to statements for such things as mutual aid and support.

MACA Military Assistance to Civil Authorities – Support provided to the State of NH. This support can range from assisting during an ice storm to providing civil defense at Seabrook. Formerly called MSCA.

MOU Memorandum of Understanding – See Memorandum of Agreement

ABBREVIATIONS & DEFINITIONS

AAG Assistant Adjutant General – The head of each of the separate components of the New Hampshire (Air or Army) National Guard reporting to the Adjutant General, also known as the Director of the (Air or Army) National Guard.

ATC – Air Traffic Control provides ATC services at Pease ANGB and deployed locations

CACO Congressional Affairs Contact Officer – Works as the liaison between the National Guard and federally elected officials.

CD Counter Drug – A federally funded mission where the New Hampshire National Guard provides prevention efforts, education, and drug interdiction in support of state, federal and local agencies.

COS Chief of Staff – Senior Army National Guard officer reporting to the Adjutant General and Director of the New Hampshire Army National Guard for all military matters.

CSD Civilian Support Detachment - Facilitates, advises and assesses a local incident commander during a Weapons of Mass Destruction event. Name changed from Rapid Assessment Initial Detection (RAID).

CTF Combined Task Force – Military force combine two military component organizations for a specific mission.

CTG Command Training Guidance – Guidance to all subordinate units from the Director of the New Hampshire Army National Guard.

DCSAVS Deputy Chief of Staff Aviation Section - Responsible for all NHARNG aviation and aircraft maintenance.

DCSIM Deputy Chief of Staff Information Management- Responsible for information management including records storage/management, automation, telecommunication, visual information and distribution.

DCSLOG Deputy Chief of Staff Logistics- Responsible for supply and ground maintenance for the NHARNG.

DCSOPS Deputy Chief of Staff Operations – Responsible for mobilization, training and military support of plans, operations and preparedness for the New Hampshire Army National Guard. Formerly called POTO.






